
Covid-19 Vaccine Resource Booklet

From conversations with the community, we have learned there are some fears and questions surrounding the vaccine, as well as barriers to finding and having transportation to vaccination clinics. In response we have created this booklet to address these concerns and provide general info . We hope this can be a helpful resource that can be used and shared within the community.





Benefits



-The Covid-19 vaccine will help keep you from contracting Covid-19, the highest prevention rate is 95%

-The vaccine may also protect people around you, especially for severe illness from Covid-19

-The Covid-19 vaccine helps keep you from getting you seriously ill even if you do get Covid-19



According to a recent report by the CDC (Center for Disease Control), if the vast majority of people get vaccinated and continue with precautions, under the most optimistic scenario, deaths from Covid-19 could drop into the low 100s per week in August, and into the tens peer week in September

Safety



-According to the CDC, all Covid-19 vaccines that are currently available in Ohio are SAFE and EFFECTIVE at preventing Covid-19

-These vaccines have undergone and will continue to undergo the most intensive monitoring in US history

-The vaccines were evaluated in 40 plus people in clinical trials and met the requirements to support emergency use authorization

Common Questions

Is it safe if I want to have a baby one day?
--Yes! There is no evidence the Covid-19 vaccine causes any problems with pregnancy

Will the vaccine alter my DNA?
--No! Vaccines cannot change or interact with your DNA in any way

Can the Vaccine make me sick with Covid-19?
--None of the authorized and recommended vaccines contain the live virus that causes
Covid-19

Side Effects

*If you have had alergic reactions to vaccines in the past or have other severe allergies contact your doctor to see if the vaccine will be safe for you

150 million vaccines have been administered

Severe effects are rare...

**As of April 2021

That's only 75 cases per 10,000 people!

.005% may have resulted in a serious side effect

- Available for ages 12 and up
- 2 doses, 3 weeks apart
- 95% effectiveness
- Fully vaccinated 2 weeks after 2nd dose

- Available for ages 18 and up
- 2 doses, 4 weeks apart
- 94.1% effectiveness
- Fully vaccinated 2 weeks after 2nd dose

Johnson & Johnson

- Available for ages 18 and up
- 1 dose
- 66.3% effectiveness
- Fully vaccinated 2 weeks after dose

*You can still contract Covid19 after taking the vaccine.
However the vaccine
significantly prevents you
from getting serverly ill.
Recent data showed that no
one who got Covid-19 four
weeks after receiving the J&J
vaccine had to be
hospitalized

FREE for anyone living in the U.S., regardless of your immigration status or if you have insurance




*If you do not have your immigration documents, please to go to a walk-in clinic because making an appt generally requires these



Testing and treatment of vaccination paid by the government WILL NOT affect anyone's immigration status or be shared with immigration agencies

A social security # and/or government ID may be requested but it is <u>NOT</u> required
